

31st Lubbock Arts Festival Juried Gallery

This competition is part of the annual Lubbock Arts Festival, April 30 - May 1, 2009 and is open to all artists working in any fine arts media. The Lubbock Arts Festival is a project of the Lubbock Arts Alliance, Inc.

ELIGIBILITY

■ Open to all artists in all media. ■ Entries must be original in design and execution. ■ Entries must have been completed within the last two years. ■ Works completed in a workshop or under supervision are ineligible.

ENTRY FEES

■ \$15 per entry. ■ Each artist may have no more than three works represented in the show, but the number of entries is not limited. ■ Entry fees are non-refundable.

SUBMISSIONS

■ Submit one digital image for each two-dimensional work and two or three images for each three-dimensional work on a CD labeled with the artist's name. JPEG images on the CD must be saved using the title of the art work to correspond with the title on the application form(s). The CD may be hand delivered to the Lubbock Arts Alliance, 511 Ave. K or mailed to P.O. Box 5092, Lubbock, TX 79408.

■ All accepted works will remain on display for the duration of the 31st Annual Lubbock Arts Festival.

AWARDS

Up to \$2000 in cash prizes awarded at the juror's discretion.

SALES

All artwork must be for sale at the price listed on the entry form. Lubbock Arts Alliance will retain a 33 1/3% commission on all Gallery sales.

REPRODUCTION

The Lubbock Arts Alliance retains the right to reproduce work for publicity purposes. Submission of an entry to this exhibition shall indicate an agreement on the part of the artist to these conditions.

SHIPPING

■ Works should be shipped ready for installation, packed in sturdy reusable containers. ■ Do not send work in Styrofoam chips. ■ Return shipping labels required
■ Artist pays all shipping charges.

Juror: Dr. Marvin Moon

As an artist, Dr. Marvin Moon paints primarily in watercolors and acrylics, although he often uses oils. His subject matter teems with images from his most intimate experiences and range from New Mexico adobes and landscapes to West Texas plains and grain elevators to Pennsylvania mountains and woods.

Born and raised in the Texas Panhandle, Marvin Moon received his BA in Art at West Texas State U. in Canyon and worked in Amarillo for over a decade as a technical illustrator, freelance commercial artist and local gallery artist. Returning to school, he received an MA from New Mexico Highlands in Las Vegas and a Ph.D. from Penn State. Subsequently, he took a position as a professor of art at Texas Tech in Lubbock where he taught research, painting and design and was the Graduate Coordinator. He retired in 1996.

Moon has exhibited in over a hundred national competitive shows, including Watercolor USA, Midwest Watercolor, Texas Watercolor, Kentucky Watercolor, Water Media US Open, and Watercolor Art Society—Houston, and won a number of awards, including six first places. His paintings are in the collections of a number of institutions and several hundred private collections in the U.S. and overseas. He was Editor of *TRENDS*, the official, juried journal of the Texas Art Education Association, for nine years and was selected the Outstanding Art Educator in the State of Texas in 1979.

Moon has served as judge or jurist for numerous exhibitions in the region including juror of awards at the Taos Invitational Exhibition in 2005.

After retirement, Moon was part of the stable of artists and co-owner and of Dos Lunas Gallery on the Plaza in Taos, NM for seven years. Currently he is represented by Wilder Nightingale Gallery in Taos and on the Dos Lunas Fine Art Studio website (www.doslunasstudio.com).
